



Theme: Integrating Innovation

The world forever transformed on November 30, 2022, with the grand introduction of Chat Gpt. This groundbreaking announcement did not merely unveil a run-of-the-mill chatbot. Instead, it revealed an intellectual marvel—a system with the remarkable capacity to learn and adapt. A mere couple of years ago, the idea of artificial intelligence programs becoming integral to our daily lives was unfathomable. Yet, today, we find ourselves in a reality where AI programs like Chat Gpt have become a global sensation, effortlessly producing plays rivalling that of Shakespeare and conjuring artwork rivalling Van Gogh himself. Her insightful remarks underscore the importance of maintaining a delicate balance between innovation and societal well-being. For example, in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) industries, concerns have emerged about the persisting gender disparities, with women still facing more significant challenges in accessing equal opportunities.

Additionally, unequal access to digital technologies persists, leaving less developed communities behind in the digital revolution. Aside from ethical concerns, environmental advocates have also voiced their apprehensions about the ecological impact of rapid technological advancement. The acidification of our oceans, exacerbated by human activities, presents a grave concern that cannot be overlooked. Likewise, the sustainability of space-based research and manufacturing necessitates careful consideration to ensure future generations can venture beyond Earth's boundaries.

For delegates of the CSIAMUN XVI, as the next generation of global leaders and avid innovators, integrating innovation through international cooperation should be held dear to their hearts. In confronting these multifaceted challenges, global partnerships assume paramount importance. By promoting a collective effort that spans borders and transcends boundaries, we can aspire to foster a future where technological progress is revolutionary but also equitable, responsible, and sustainable.

Conference Registeration

Registrations will be made available through our registration form on our website csiamun. org from mid-October. Delegates can register either by themselves or as part of a delegation.

All international delegates must register as part of their school delegation and will be required to register by January 8th. The registration form will need Contact, Advisor, and Delegation information.

Domestic delegates may register either as part of their school delegation or individually.

*Domestic delegates denote delegates whose primary residence/school is located in Korea. Domestic delegates must have at least one parent/legal guardian present in Korea during the duration of the conference.

All delegations must have a minimum of one adult advisor/parent accompany them to Korea. Delegations are free to substitute students or advisors as long as the number of delegates and advisors remains unchanged until January 22nd. Visa letters will be produced on request.

Fees and Refund Policy

Our fee includes the conference itself, housing at our conference venue for three nights (international), two nights (domestic), insurance, and 7-9 meals throughout the conference.

The fee for international delegates will be 500 USD. Airport transfer costs are not included. All costs noted are per delegate. We encourage delegation advisors to stay at our venue and support their students, and if this is the case, advisors will also be charged the conference fee. If the cost hinders your ability to attend, please contact us to discuss your options further.

Domestic delegates' fees will be 320,000 KRW during regular registration and 340,000 KRW during late registration. Discounted rates are available for returning delegates, students of Cheongshim International Academy, and during early registration.

The fee should be transferred via wire transfer to our school account. All fees are due by the respective registration deadlines. All bank charges are the responsibility of advisors/delegates. Tax invoices will be available upon request.

Venue, Accommodation, and Transportation



Our conference will be held at Cheongshim International Youth Center, a medium-capacity conference centre featuring state-of-the-art technology and facilities. The centre is also in Gapyeong, Gyeonggi Province. The drive to our school and the nearby Cheongshim International Medical Center is ten minutes. The drive from Seoul takes about 1-2 hours.

On-site accommodation and meals will be provided for every delegate, inclusive of the conference fee. International Delegations will be housed in rooms of two to three.



Do note our facility entails "안방마루," the Korean floor-based room plans. Bed-type rooms are available at request. For a detailed description of the accommodation, refer to the facility's website.



International Delegates should plan on arriving at Incheon Airport (ICN) on the evening of the 13th or the morning of the 14th. Airport transfers from Incheon Airport will be offered at a fee on the 13th, 14th, and 16th.

Complimentary transportation shuttles from Seoul Station, Seohyeon Station, and Gangnam Express Bus Terminal are available for all other delegates.
